

Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Reviewing the service for Ash Wednesday, the first worship service in Lent I read - "the disciplines of Lent..." - as if Lent wasn't depressing enough! (Just the sound of the word is depressing "laaaa-ent", and now we're adding "disciplines" to it.) The term conjures up images of standing in a corner, a teacher wielding a ruler (remember those days?), and a scolding parent bending down to yell with a shaking finger. What a way to celebrate a season of the church!

But then again, we don't often think of "celebrating" Lent: our minds and hearts are instead filled by the weight of our sins and the thoughts of our own mortality. We traditionally approach this season with somber tones and a sacrificial penance of a favorite candy.

Why?

The word "lent" translates as "Spring" a time we are all excitedly awaiting, a time when flowers appear with bright colors, the trees are full of buds, the animals start hopping about and the days grow longer with the warmth of a bright sun in the beautiful blue sky. Certainly sounds like something worth celebrating...

And it is a celebration! Lent is a time to celebrate Baptism, that wonderful time when we all come together and the warm water washes over us and the Word of God fills us and all the sins stuck to us come off. The church fills with applause and songs and smiles as we stand forgiven, welcome brothers and sisters in the family of God.

Now that's something to celebrate!

And we do during Lent: not some wimpy half-hearted celebration, but a full blown one, giving our whole heart, mind, soul, and strength into it! During Lent we give everything we have, because Lent reminds us that everything we have has been given to us...

During Lent we celebrate by giving ourselves through prayer, worship, fasting, and service – disciplines – ways by which we come to understand the fullness of the gift we have been given. In Baptism God has washed away our sins: we are *forgiven*. The burden of sin is lifted off of us, no longer dragging us down in the despair of death, and now *we can live*. Lent is the spring time for our souls, a time for us to celebrate that we – you and me – are re-born!

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – won't you come celebrate with us?






Church Council Highlights from February:

- WELCA & LCM paid for the repairs done to the refrigerator and freezer.

- The property committee will be replacing the weather stripping at the main entrance and the west side double doors.
- A letter of resignation was received from Gail Marquardt.
- A network & backup system for the computers needs to be created.




