

According to legend, a mother pelican, in times of famine, would pluck open her chest and feed her young with her own blood. An alternate myth was that she fed her dying young with her blood to revive them, losing her own life in the process. The depiction of a pelican with a drop of blood on her chest is called "the pelican in her piety."

Message from Pastor Brian

Grace and Peace to you from our Risen Lord!

I hope you all at least poke your heads into the church building the evenings of July 21-23. These are the dates of our Vacation Bible School, and I hope you witness even just a fraction of the children's activity in those dates.

VBS has been something I remember dating back to my own childhood, and not only does it give parents a chance to take a breather and let us take care of them for two hours a night, but it gives us the opportunity to share the gospel with kids, both those connected to our congregation at CULC and those who are not.

The first night, we will be exploring the idea that God wants to spend time with us, and so we will be talking about Jesus inviting children into his presence. The second night, we will be talking about how God cares about what happens to us, and we will be using the story of Jesus calming the storm from the boat. On the third and final night, we will learn all about how God keeps his promises, so we will explore Jesus' teaching of God caring for even the smallest things such as flowers and small birds.

Maybe you need to hear those words too. I certainly do. It matters to me, in a world full or worry and conflict, that we have a God who is not far off from us, but in fact wants to know us inside and out. It's important that we have a God who protects us, and it's important that we have a God who wants everyone, even those who might sometimes be pushed aside, to be in his presence. One of my main learnings in seminary was in my Systematic Theology class, when we discussed that what happened to Jesus was important because in our Trinitarian theology, what happened to Jesus happened to God. So yes, all of those things that Jesus says to us in scripture reveals God's will do us.



The CULC Messenger God's Work, Our Actions And just as God cared for the children, we all must care for them. People have said to me in congregations before, "the children are our future." Yes, but the children are also our PRESENT. They are here now, and they have opinions, and they have ideas, and just like us, they want to be able to express them and feel heard. This is why our children's sermons in worship are important. And I don't know about you, but I find that they sometimes challenge me in a good wav!

Peace be to you as we prepare for VBS. Come and see what we are up to!







Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.

What you need:

- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help




What you do:

- Have an adult slice the lime in half.
 Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
- Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half.
- Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
- Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
- Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects don't like.

6. Supervise the flame. Blow it out when it reaches the bottom lime.
