



So here we are, starting a new journey together! I am excited. As I write this,

I am actually sitting in the office at St. Peter's in Pine Grove, with boxes everywhere. There are even some on a hand truck waiting for me to drive them up to Christ's United!

Now, we had to order it from Amazon. Before, I had someone in the store who could guide me and help me get what I need. Now, I'm just guessing. And the whole thing had me a little frustrated.

A violinist once performed in the New York City subway, entertaining passersby for 45 minutes. A few tossed him cash, totaling about \$30 by the time he concluded.

Little did anyone know, Joshua Bell was one of the world's best violinists. That day, he played one of the most complex musical pieces ever written on an instrument worth \$3.5 million. Indeed, a few days earlier Bell had performed a sold-out concert in Boston, where tickets averaged \$100.

Sometimes God does extraordinary things right in the middle of our ordinary lives, yet we don't notice. You're offered an opportunity you almost pass up, thinking it's not worth your time or effort. But upon taking part, you find it leads to your life's calling. 




Thank God for the Little Things


