

Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Prayer changes things.

We've heard that over and over throughout our lives, most often by caring persons who are offering means of comfort during a difficult time. And although we may politely agree, normally we do not jump into trying it, but when we do get there.... It works. Prayer DOES change things.

Prayer alters our perspective, our mood, our hope, our ability to see and react differently. Whether we ask for something or not, whether we see a miracle or not, whether we are bowed on our knees or bowed by the weight of our tears, prayer changes things.

There is something of a miraculous quality in prayer, the ability to talk with the divine Creator of the universe. In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus taught us that to pray we are to talk - not to make fancy speeches, but converse - with our Abba, which means "Daddy". Conversation calms our soul and gives us the ability to see things from a different perspective. It works with God, and it works with others.

Conversation, especially with those we are upset with, allows us to work through our feelings and understand the other person. By talking and listening to each other, we are able to see things differently, to open new doors of understanding, and work together for solutions that benefit the whole.

During my service as a chaplain, I went to visit a woman who promptly demanded to know my denominational background. When I told her Lutheran, she refused to talk with me because "(Lutherans) don't believe in speaking in tongues". I responded "I speak German, Latin, and Greek, isn't that enough?". She said "You know German?". That simple statement opened the door to praying together, conversation, and comfort during her illness.

This season of Pentecost, while the grass and the flowers grow around us, let prayer grow in us. As individuals, as a congregation, as a community, let us grow in our conversation with our Creator. Let's jump into it with both hands and an open heart, together. Each day at noon, just pause for a moment to offer this prayer: "God, thank you for this day and this life. May everything that happens bring me closer to You. In Jesus' name, Amen." This simple beginning will open the door to a conversation with God like described by Paul:

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Prayer DOES change things. May it change us.




