

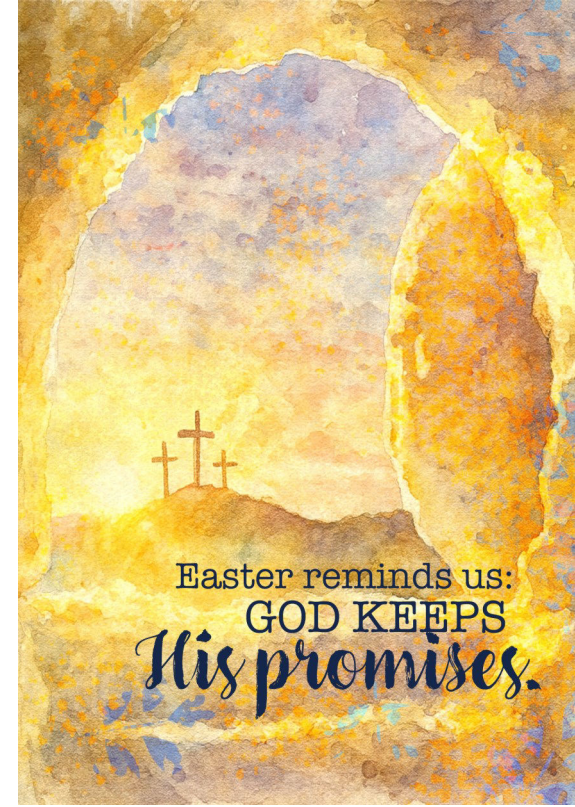

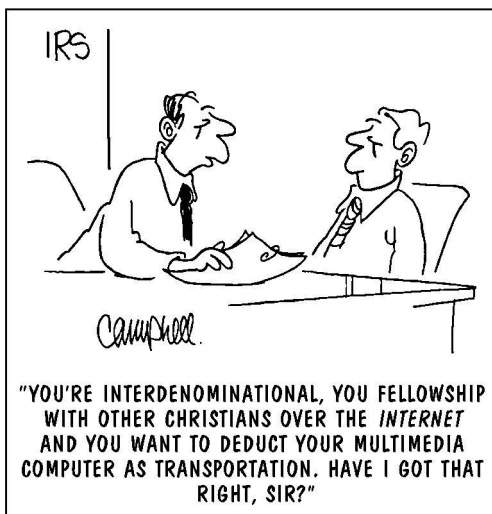

Dear Friends in Christ,

The center of our faith is the resurrection, and the hope and the joy it brings. And as always, we will be celebrating, with not one, but two services on Easter Sunday! .

Our Easter Sunrise Service will be held at **6:30 AM on April 5.**

Now, I'll be honest with you: I am not, by temperament or spiritual gifting, a morning person. If there were a later sunrise option, I would gladly lobby for it. If Jesus had risen at, say, 9:00 AM, I would have found that deeply meaningful and personally affirming.


And yet—there is something powerful about gathering in the quiet, in the dim light, as the world slowly wakes up. There's something about proclaiming, "He is risen!" at an hour when most of the world is still rubbing its eyes that makes the joy feel even more surprising, even more alive.

So yes, I will be there—with coffee, with hope, and probably with at least one yawn. I invite you to join me in that beautiful, slightly sleepy celebration of the resurrection.

And if 6:30 AM feels like a bridge too far, don't worry—we will also gather for worship at **9:30 AM**, when both the sun and Pastor Brian are a bit more fully risen.

But Easter joy isn't meant to stay in the sanctuary—it's meant to be shared. The good news of the resurrection, the promise that death does not have the final word, the hope of eternal life—this is a gift we carry into the world.

So as we celebrate, I encourage you to think about how you might share that joy with others. Here are three simple, practical ways:

- **Invite someone** – Easter is one of the easiest times to extend an invitation. A friend, neighbor, or family member might be more open than you think. A simple, “Come sit with me” can go a long way.
- **Speak hope in everyday moments** – When conversations turn to worry, fear, or uncertainty, gently share the hope you have. You don’t need a sermon—just a word of peace, a reminder that God is at work even in hard times.
- **Show resurrection in action** – Acts of kindness, forgiveness, and generosity are powerful witnesses. Bring a meal, make a call, offer grace where it’s not expected—these are ways people *see* the resurrection alive in you.

However you join us—early and heroic at sunrise, or joyfully well-rested at 9:30—I hope you’ll not only celebrate the resurrection, but carry it with you into the lives of others.

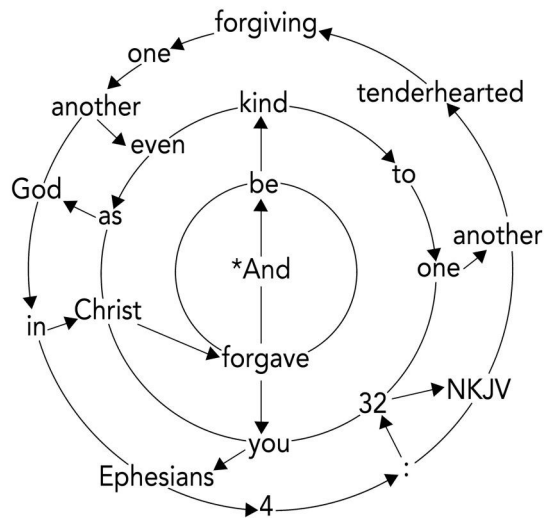

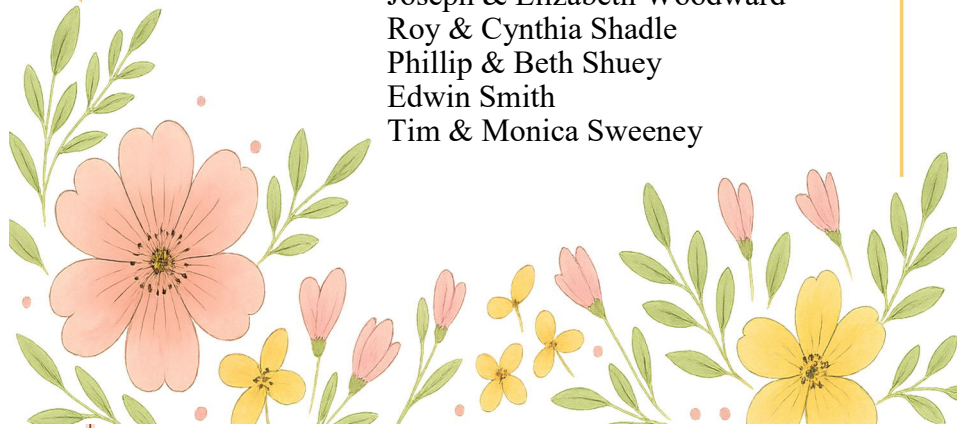

## Christian symbol

**PEACOCK** — The beautiful peacock is likely one of the lesser-known Christian symbols. Based on an ancient myth that its flesh doesn't decay after death, early Christians appropriated the bird as a symbol of immortality. The molting of its tail feathers each year to be replaced with supposedly more beautiful ones led to use of the peacock as a sign of resurrection and glorification.

Additionally, the eye-like pattern in the peacock's tail feathers made it a symbol of conscience and of God, who sees all. However, the peacock also represents arrogance as it struts to show off its plumage. During the Baroque period, the peacock was often part of artwork at the 10th Station of the Cross, depicting Jesus stripped of his clothing—atonement, according to some teachings, specifically for our sin of vanity.

Early Christians believed peacocks shriek when they catch sight of their feet, which they consider ugly. Christians took this as a reminder that we, too, should lament our spiritual imperfections that detract from the beauty of life lived in Christ.

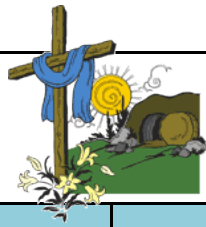

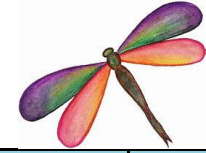
